#### Diverse Library Models - 3 "AHA" Moments

When considering libraries, the idea of repository of books comes to mind, however, the evolutions of libraries has made the impact even greater on the community. New library models are up and coming, bringing in groundbreaking technology and services that might not have been possible in the past. For example, more and more libraries have been offering makerspaces that allow greater hands-on experience with different tools and materials. Libraries have further expanded their services to bring new resources, where "things, animals, seeds, or even people" can be checked out, going beyond books (Everett, 2023). Chaos is further embraced in libraries, encouraging play and help children build skills need to prepare them for school, and encourage imagination, creativity and development (Creative Library Concepts, 2022). The idea of Open+Access is challenging the issue of time to bring resources and services beyond operating hours (Bibliotheca, n.d.). The idea of new and diverse library models, specifically models that bring new resources and expands the idea of traditional, quiet library models to bring more to the community.




# The Barriers are Not Equal - 3 "AHA" Moments
